TRADITIONALLY, THE LIFELIKE figures of rock, were erected by the Inuit and stand along Canada's most northern shores. (Pronounced In-OOO-Shook), an Inuit word meaning "in the image of man" the sculptures served as guides and beacons for safe travel and bountiful hunting grounds.

The Vancouver 2010 Olympic Winter Games emblem is an interpretation of the Inukshuk, which over time has evolved into a symbol of friendship, an expression of the hospitality of a country that enthusiastically welcomes all people from all corners of the world.

Our Inukshuk is carved from one piece of local stone and each piece is one of a kind.

Sizes measure from 5" to 36" high.
